M6 GT3

SP9 CLASS



The Nürburgring 24 hours of 2020 is underway! – and in very wet conditions, which are expected to persist through the race. As a result, all cars have started the race on wet tyres.

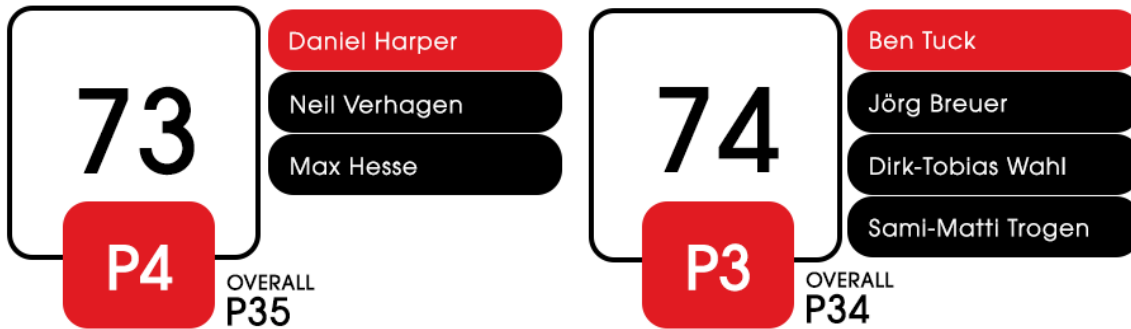
The Pro driver #101 Walkenhorst Motorsport BMW M6 GT3 was started by Christian Krognès – who also set the qualifying lap, and at the end of the first hour, the car is running 12th overall, just over 1 minute 30 seconds from the lead. Krognès dropped a few places at the start, but then made a few spots back, both on track, and due to early pit stops.



The #100 Pro-Am M6 GT3 was started by Andreas Ziegler, and lost ground at the start and is now running in 27th in the SP9 class, and 50th overall.

M4 GT4

SP8T CLASS



In the SP8T class, the BMW M4 GT4s have slipped down from their 1-2 positions on the grid in the early phase of the race, with the pole-sitting #73 car, now driven by Daniel Harper, dropping to fourth in class, while Ben Tuck is running third in class at the end of the first hour – with neither car having yet served a pit stop.
