SP9 CLASS



Jordan Pepper's stint behind the wheel of the #101 BMW M6 GT3 was cut short, after rain began falling again at the Nordschleife.

The South African driver took over from David Pittard at the end of the fourth hour, and the team switched to intermediate tyres, with Pepper quickly setting the car's best lap of the race, before it started raining again on the far part of the circuit.

Pepper was therefore back in to the pits after just 40 minutes to hand the car back over to Christian Krognes, and switch back to full wet tyres.







SP8T CLASS





Max Hesse continues to lead the SP8T class in his BMW M4 GT4, now a lap clear of his nearest rival, while Sami-Matti Trogen is now still behind the wheel of the #74 car, fourth in the class – with both M4s having continued on the wet tyres.
