David Pittard was the last driver in the car and took the car over the line, while the #100 car was retired with just under two hours to go.



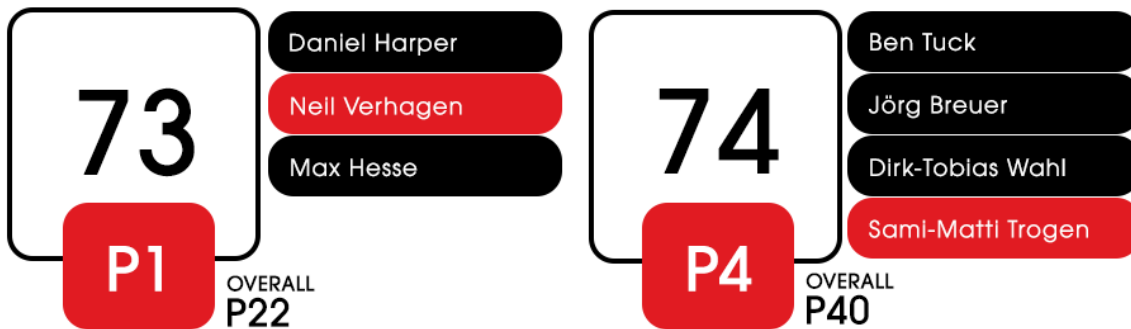
